Symbol of power and ingenuity, its name evokes the imposing ships of the emperor Caligula. A journey through time, the breath of history.



Grapes	45% Bellone – 45% Vermentino – 10% Chardonnay

Vinification & aging

The grapes intended for blending were vinified separately and only later assembled. The must, obtained by soft pressing, was subjected to cold static decanting to promote natural clarification. Fermentation, conducted with selected yeasts, took place at a controlled temperature of 18 °C for 12 days. The wine is then aged for 6 months on fine lees in stainless steel tanks and then subjected to mild filtration before bottling, thus preserving its structure and flavor persistence.

Aromatic profile characterized by citrus notes of Mandarin, lemon and grapefruit, accompanied by fruity nuances of white peach and pear. The olfactory bouquet is enriched by floral nuances and a subtle mineral composition.

Curiosity about the wine's name [Caliga]

The name is inspired by Gaius Caesar, son of Germanicus, better known as *Caligola* – an emperor with an eccentric personality, surrounded by countless anecdotes. A lover of water and navigation, faithful to the Egyptian and later Hellenistic tradition of sanctuary ships, ceremonial rituals, and the Eastern cult of Isis, between 37 and 41 AD he had two extraordinary, monumental, and lavish ships built, following Egyptian tradition and the cult of Isis.
